DISCUSSION GUIDE WEEK 2 Fight For The Heart

ICEBREAKER:

If you had to delete all but three apps from your smartphone, which ones would you keep?

BIG IDEA:

Today's big idea: Showing that we are trustworthy as parents captures our children's hearts and reflects God's.

DAILY BIBLE READING (Optional):

Our daily Bible readings prepare us for the message.

> Deuteronomy 6:20-25; Exodus 14:5-14; Psalm 9:7-10; John 10:11-18; 1 John 4:19-21

> Was there a particular passage that stood out to you?

SCRIPTURE: Deuteronomy 6:5; Deuteronomy 6:20-24, 1 John 4:19

DISCUSSION:

1. Was there something that stood out to you from Pastor Brett's message? Was there a thought or principle that was encouraging or challenging?
2. Have someone read Deuteronomy 6:5. What does it mean to "love the Lord your God...with all your heart, soul, and strength? In what ways are you living this out, in what ways are you holding back?
3. Do you think heart, soul, strength are three different things, or a unique way of saying the same thing?
4. Have someone read Deuteronomy 6:20-24, what question does Moses say the children should ask their parents? What were the Israelites instructed to reply when the children asked?
5. Why do you think Moses put such a strong emphasis on teaching the children or the next generation?

LIFE APPLICATION:

1. What do you do (or will do if you become a parent) to earn the trust of your children? How have you been earning the trust of other young people in your life?
2. What are you doing to pass God's truth to the next generation? Where are some areas you are doing well, are there areas you could grow in?

Take Time:

As you spend time praying for each other and your various needs, pray this prayer over your group, "**Lord, let my life of obedience serve future generations. Let me be ready to answer anyone who asks me why I put my trust in you.**"
